

Korekh ... Hillel Sandwich (bitter herbs, *kharoset* & matzah) כּוֹרֵךְ

In memory of the holy Temple, we do as Hillel did in Temple times. He put *matzah* and bitter herbs together and ate them as a sandwich, to literally observe the words of *Torah*, “they shall eat it (the Passover offering) with *matzah* and bitter herbs.”

Lifting the *matzah* with the *maror* and *kharoset* let us all say together:

We dip the bitter herbs into *kharoset* to remind ourselves that even the most bitter of circumstances can be sweetened by the hope we have in God.
